Low winds/no snow transport when I was up there and the east face had little to no wind effect, probably 16-18in new snow. Saw this <u>slide</u> with about a 8-12in crown and 100ft wide on the north face, didn't see any other activity aside from some small point releases on really steep east aspects.

From another party: Saw a sizable avalanche on the north east face of Blackmore, likely broke mid storm and was partly filled in already - estimated 20" deep, 100' wide. Had shooting cracks and collapsing while ascending northeast ridge. Hand pits showed planar results on an 8" harder <u>slab</u> beneath all the blower on top.
